Late Supervision Reports

It is primarily through the review of supervision reports that the Board monitors the performance of psychologists on the Candidate Register. It is the Board's duty to ensure that candidates are practicing at an appropriate level for supervised practice at all times. It is important to ensure problems are identified and corrective actions swiftly taken.

While most candidates and supervisors submit reports in a timely fashion or alert the office with respect to unavoidable delays, there are a concerning number of cases wherein reports have been very late without reasonable explanation provided. As a result of this, the Board has added points 2 and 3 below to existing policy with respect to the timing of reports.

LATE SUPERVISION REPORTS:

1. Reports are expected to be received in a timely fashion
2. Reports overdue by 60 days will not be approved for credit unless a reasonable explanation for the failure to submit on time is provided
3. Reports overdue by 90 days without both prior notification and reasonable explanation will be reviewed but not credited towards hours of supervised work experience
4. Repeated failure to submit forms in a timely fashion will result in the Board considering an administrative removal of the Candidate for failing to abide by the conditions of candidacy
